What is *Shelter Project Hope*?

Shelter Project Hope is one of our oldest ministries. This organization owns and operates a triplex apartment to assist individuals and families who are experiencing financial difficulties by providing them free housing and utilities for a 3-month period.

How does Shelter Project Hope help people? Project Hope not only allows individuals free housing in their triplex, but allows them time to accumulate funds to get back on their feet financially. This ministry also assist these clients in acquiring additional resources and counseling services. They also minister to those in need.

How can I join this ministry? Volunteers are always needed to keep this organization operating. We need people to visit our clients, to minister and mentor to them and to share their special skills such as assisting with budgeting, homemaking, employment, and education. We need others to assist with the operations of our Triplex. Mowing and minor repairs may fall in this category.

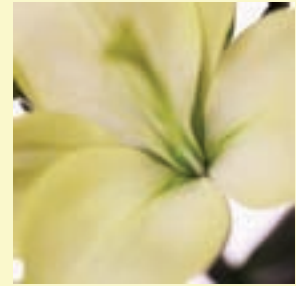
